






University of Sunderland (UoS), UK


Developmental / Child Psychology

Developmental Psychology is the study of human growth (physical, mental, emotional, etc) from young to old. In addition, this subject will teach about special-needs individuals such as those with autism and attention-deficit hyperactive disorder (ADHD) so that students will understand the differences between healthy individuals and special-needs individuals. Job opportunities: special-needs educators, social workers. Relevant fields for post-graduate studies: Child Psychology, Developmental Psychology, Applied Behaviour Analysis.



Abnormal Psychology


Abnormal Psychology is the study of unusual behaviours and focuses on mental illnesses such as depression and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). At the degree level, students will understand the fundamentals of different types of mental illnesses. To practise as clinical psychologists, a Master's Degree in Clinical Psychology is required.



Forensic Psychology

Forensic Psychology is the study of the application of psychological knowledge to criminal investigation and law. Forensic psychologists are able to perform psychological assessments on criminals. Job opportunities: Forensic Psychology students need at least a Master's or a PhD to work as forensic psychologists or researchers.

Relevant fields for post-graduate studies: Criminal Psychology, Forensic Psychology, Law.



Cognitive Psychology

Cognitive Psychology is the study of how the human mind works. Topics such as attention, perception, memory and problem-solving, are covered. Job opportunities: To practise as neurofeedback* therapists, students need at least a Master's or a PhD to work in cognitive psychology.

Relevant fields for post-graduate studies: Cognitive Psychology, Neuroscience, Cognitive Behaviour Therapy.


**During a neurofeedback session, the therapist uses EEG to record brainwaves and makes suggestions to change a particular behaviour based on the results of the machine.*

BRANCHES OF PSYCHOLOGY



Clinical Psychology

Clinical psychology is the branch of psychology concerned with the assessment and treatment of mental illness, abnormal behaviour, and psychiatric problems. This field integrates the science of psychology with the treatment of complex human problems, making it an exciting career choice for people who are looking to work in a challenging and rewarding field.



Industrial / Organisational Psychology

Industrial / Organisational psychology is the branch of psychology that applies psychological theories, methods and research in understanding and improving workers, workplaces, and an organisations' productivity and well-being. Other similar terms are occupational psychology, work psychology, work and organisational psychology, managerial psychology, management psychology, personnel psychology, consumer psychology, engineering psychology, business psychology, human resource management, and organisational behaviour.



Counselling Psychology

Counselling psychology is the branch of psychology that applies psychological theories, methods and research in working collaboratively with clients across a diverse range of human problems such as vocational selection, school problems, drug abuse, and marital conflict. In contrast to clinical psychologists, counselling psychologists often work with clients who are experiencing less severe symptoms. Other related terms are guidance and counselling.



Educational Psychology

Educational psychology is the branch of psychology that applies psychological theories, methods and research in understanding and improving how humans learn in educational settings, the effectiveness of educational interventions, the psychology of teaching, and the social psychology of schools as organisations. Another related term is school psychology.



Neuropsychology

Neuropsychology is the branch of psychology that applies psychological theories, methods and research in the assessment and treatment of behaviour directly related to brain function. Other related terms are neuroscience and cognitive neuropsychology, and clinical neuropsychology.

DR OLIVER ROBINSON
Associate Professor of Psychology

Dr Oliver Robinson is the Academic Portfolio Lead for Psychology and Counselling, the programme lead for BSc (Hons) Psychology and BSc Psychology with Counselling, and a Year-3 course coordinator for Adult Development and Mental Health.

His research focuses on how identity, wellbeing and mental health are affected by major life transitions, crises and the ageing process during adulthood. He has published several books including *Development through Adulthood*, and his research has gained interest from the media, including the *New Scientist*, *The Guardian*, *BBC Radio 4*, *The Telegraph* and *The Times*.



PROFESSOR JOSH DAVIS
Chartered Psychologist

Dr Josh P Davis is a Chartered Psychologist. His PhD was on the "Forensic Identification of Unfamiliar Faces in CCTV Images" (2007) and he has since published research on human-face recognition and eyewitness identification, the reliability of facial composite systems (e.g., E-FIT, EFIT-V), and methods used by expert witnesses to provide evidence of identification in court ('facial comparison evidence').

He is regularly being interviewed by the international media and his first co-edited book "Forensic Facial Identification: Theory and Practice of Identification from Eyewitnesses, Composites and CCTV" (Wiley Blackwell) was published in 2015. In 2019, his collaboration with VisionMetric to examine human and computer face-processing was awarded £300,000 by Innovate UK.



DR CHRISTIAN PERRIN
Link Tutor

Dr Christian Perrin is the Link Tutor for SEGi College Subang Jaya's BSc (Hons) Psychology programme. His specialty is forensic psychology and qualitative methods. More specifically, he is interested in experiences of imprisonment, prison to community transition, and the stigmatisation of marginalised individuals. Having spent four years living and working in Singapore (2016 - 2020), he maintains a wide network of collaborations within the higher education sector and within criminal justice systems internationally. Furthermore, he retains partnerships with international charities such as the Samaritans.




NORHAYATI BINTI BASRI
